

Anzac Day Trust Fund Grant Program 2025

Stream B Recipients

Under Stream B of the 2025 Anzac Day Trust Grant Program, eligible ex-services organisations will receive grant funding for innovative projects to address the needs of veterans and their dependents over the next 12 months.

Applicants had to demonstrate how their activities will provide improved outcomes for the veteran community.

Stream B Grant Recipients are listed in alphabetical order below.

2025 Anzac Day Trust Fund Grant Program - Stream B Recipients	
1	Australian War Widows Queensland will receive \$25,000 to deliver transport and catering for events in various locations across Queensland.
2	Buddy Up Australia will receive \$19,300 to deliver a program of social events and to purchase equipment, including a portable defibrillator, first aid kits, a vehicle fridge/freezer, and a portable barbeque.
3	Bundaberg Legacy will receive \$46,500 to deliver a community connection program, mowing and yard cleaning, education assistance for children, emergency funds, and wages for a welfare and advocacy officer in Bundaberg.
4	Far North Queensland Legacy Club will receive \$63,800 to deliver a veteran-family-led hub in Cairns, including a wellbeing officer, venue hire, and an outreach campaign.
5	Gallipoli Medical Research Foundation will receive \$99,700 to deliver a research project that integrates data analysis, service mapping, and lived experience engagement to better understand veteran support programs and gaps in Queensland.
6	Legacy Club of Brisbane will receive \$50,000 to support the wages of two Community Services Officers to deliver support services to war widows in Rockhampton and the Fraser Burnett region.
7	Legacy Club of Gold Coast will receive \$43,500 to provide wages for a part-time Welfare Co-ordinator and education bursaries for children of veterans on the Gold Coast.
8	Legacy Club of Ipswich will receive \$45,200 to deliver rental subsidies for veterans and their widows/widowers, financial contributions for youth education, and youth camp attendance for children of veterans in Ipswich.
9	National Servicemen's Association (Qld) Bribie Island Branch will receive \$22,500 to deliver advocacy services, emergency financial support and in-home care services for veterans on Bribie Island.
10	Northern Queensland Legacy will receive \$7,500 to support education costs for children of veterans.
11	PTSD Resurrected Inc will receive \$46,500 to deliver trauma recovery courses, moral injury and resilience workshops, and a trauma retreat for veterans and their spouses, across Queensland.
12	RSL Boyne-Tannum Sub-Branch will receive \$7,300 for the purchase of a marquee and delivery of yoga, mindfulness, and fitness classes for its members in Tannum Sands.
13	RSL Bray Park Strathpine Sub Branch will receive \$11,500 to deliver ICT equipment and software upgrades, volunteer advocacy travel costs, home maintenance, and educational support for children of veterans in the Bray Park Strathpine area.
14	RSL Currumbin Palm Beach Sub-Branch will receive \$40,000 to support wages for a Compensation Advocate and a Wellbeing Advocate in Currumbin Palm Beach.
15	RSL Dalby Sub-Branch will receive \$26,000 to deliver volunteer transport services, mental health counselling, emergency welfare assistance, and construction of an outdoor social barbeque area in Dalby.
16	RSL Gordonvale Sub Branch will receive \$100,000 to deliver upgraded, private office spaces within the Gordonvale RSL Hall that will support veteran welfare and advocacy activities in Gordonvale.
17	RSL Helidon Sub-Branch will receive \$17,500 to provide welfare and emergency financial assistance, including in-home assistance for aged veterans, and bursaries for the children of veterans in Helidon.
18	RSL Hervey Bay will receive \$20,400 to deliver emergency hampers and fuel, phone, and honorarium expenses for wellbeing and advocacy officers in Hervey Bay.
19	RSL Murgon Sub-Branch will receive \$15,400 to deliver transportation and accommodation for veterans requiring medical treatment, personal alarms and lift chair purchases, yard maintenance, trips/outings and Anzac Day commemorations in Murgon.
20	RSL Tewantin-Noosa Sub-Branch will receive \$2,500 to renovate the garden and pathways of the RSL Memorial Cemetery.
21	Salute for Service Australia Ltd will receive \$10,000 to deliver emergency financial relief for veterans and their dependents across Queensland

22	SMEAC will receive \$96,300 to deliver temporary accommodation and wrap-around support services to veterans who are homeless, in crisis, or in transition, and to veterans' families needing counselling and a social reset on the Sunshine Coast.
23	Soldier On will receive \$50,000 to support the wages of a Senior Case Manager responsible for statewide participant intake.
24	Trojans Trek Foundation Limited will receive \$22,500 to deliver a pilot 'Partners Trek' program for veterans and their partners, focusing on relationships in the context of PTSD, depression, changing identity and values.
25	Veterans Care Association will receive \$74,400 to deliver two holistic residential retreats, peer mentor professional development, and Welfare Officer wages in the Gold Coast.
26	Veterans Mixed Martial Arts will receive \$44,000 to deliver a mixed martial arts wellbeing program and equipment for younger veterans in the Sunshine Coast region.
27	Wounded Heroes Association will receive \$25,000 to deliver veteran crisis relief payments in Townsville.
